The World Breastfeeding Trends Initiative (WBTi) as a vehicle to galvanize action to achieve World Health Assembly and Global Breastfeeding Collective targets to increase exclusive and continued breastfeeding

The International Baby Food Action Network (IBFAN) developed World Breastfeeding Trends Initiative (WBTi) tool by adapting the WHO tool for assessment of policy and programmes on infant and young child feeding. WBTi added an element of visibility to the assessment results by including colour coding, scoring and ranking. WBTi galvanizes action at country level by initiating a process to identify gaps in policy/programmes and call for action to bridge the gaps. The World Health Assembly in 2012 set targets for nutrition that included increasing exclusive breastfeeding rates to at least 50% by 2025. To achieve the targets, the 'Global Breastfeeding Collective' (GBC) has been established led by UNICEF and WHO and IBFAN is also a member. Considering that rapid progress is possible, the GBC has set ambitious targets linked to SDGs time frame, to improve early initiation of breastfeeding to 70%, exclusive breastfeeding (0-6m) to 60%, and continued breastfeeding to 80% at 1 year and 60% at 2 years by 2030. For this the GBC launched 7 policy asks. One of these asks is to monitor policy and programmes. GBC expects that by 2030 at least three quarters of countries of the world will be able to conduct a WBTi assessment every five years. The WBTi report of 84 countries (2016), revealed that several gaps exist in both policy and programmes in almost all countries. WHO believes that each country has to contribute to increased breastfeeding rates and WBTi provides an answer to galvanise action in countries. In 35 countries having done WBTi reassessments, 29 countries have made good progress in scores of policy and programmes.
